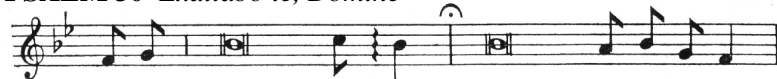

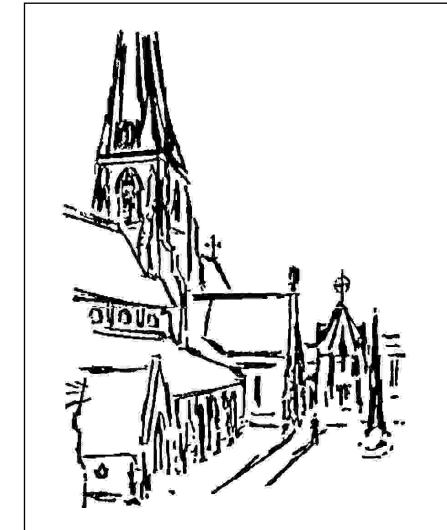
#### **COLLECT FOR THE SEARCH COMMITTEE**
