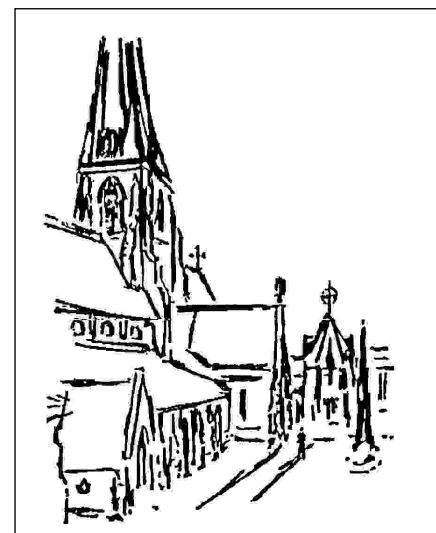
We are now actively collecting items for our **next Bazaar**: books, kitchenware, china, costume jewellery & boxes. For information please see Verna.
