## THE ORDER FOR MORNING PRAYER

*The Minister shall read aloud one or more of these Sentences of the Scriptures that follow.*

I was glad when they said unto me, Let us go into the house of the LORD.  
*Psalm 122. 1*

Thus saith the high and lofty One that inhabiteth eternity, whose name is Holy: I dwell in the high and holy place, with him also that is of a contrite and humble spirit.  
*Isaiah 57. 15*

*The Minister, turning to the people, shall say the Exhortation in the form following.*

Dearly beloved brethren, the Scripture moveth us in sundry places to acknowledge and confess our manifold sins and wickedness; and that we should not dissemble nor cloke them before the face of Almighty God our heavenly Father; but confess them with an humble, lowly, penitent, and obedient heart; to the end that we may obtain forgiveness of the same, by his infinite goodness and mercy.

And although we ought at all times humbly to acknowledge our sins before God; yet ought we most chiefly so to do, when we assemble and meet together to render thanks for the great benefits that we have received at his hands, to set forth his most worthy praise, to hear his most holy Word, and to ask those things which are requisite and necessary, as well for the body as the soul.

Wherefore I pray and beseech you, as many as are here present, to accompany me with a pure heart and humble voice unto the throne of the heavenly grace.

*A general Confession to be said of the whole Congregation with the Minister.*

**Almighty and most merciful Father,  
We have erred and strayed from thy ways like lost sheep,  
We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts,  
We have offended against thy holy laws,  
We have left undone those things which we ought to have done,  
And we have done those things which we ought not to have done;  
And there is no health in us.  
But thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us, miserable offenders.  
Spare thou them, O God, which confess their faults.  
Restore thou them that are penitent;  
According to thy promises declared unto mankind in Christ Jesu our Lord.  
And grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake, That we may hereafter live a godly,  
righteous, and sober life, To the glory of thy holy Name. Amen.**

*The Absolution, or Remission of sins, to be pronounced by the Priest alone.*

Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who desireth not the death of a sinner, but rather that he may turn from his wickedness, and live, hath given power and commandment to his Ministers, to declare and pronounce to his people, being penitent, the Absolution and Remission of their sins.

He pardoneth and absolveth all them that truly repent and unfeignedly believe his holy Gospel.

Wherefore we beseech him to grant us true repentance and his Holy Spirit, that those things may please him which we do at this present, and that the rest of our life hereafter may be pure and holy; so that at the last we may come to his eternal joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

*Minister* O Lord, open thou our lips;

*People* **And our mouth shall show forth thy praise.**

*Minister* O God, make speed to save us;

*People* **O Lord, make haste to help us.**

*Minister* Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost;

*People* **As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.**

*Minister* Praise ye the Lord;

*People* **The Lord's Name be praised.**

*Then shall be said or sung this Psalm following:*

VENITE, EXULTEMUS DOMINO. Psalm 95

**O come, let us sing unto the Lord: /  
let us heartily rejoice in the strength of our salvation.**

**Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving, /  
and show ourselves glad in him with psalms.**

**For the Lord is a great God, /  
and a great King above all gods.**

**In his hand are all the corners of the earth: /  
and the strength of the hills is his also.**

**The sea is his, and he made it: /  
and his hands prepared the dry land.**

**O come, let us worship, and fall down, /  
and kneel before the Lord our Maker.**

and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand.**

### PSALM 26:1-8

- 1 Give judgement for me, O Lord,  
for I have lived with integrity; \*  
I have trusted in the Lord and have not faltered.
- 2 **Test me, O Lord, and try me; \*  
examine my heart and my mind.**
- 3 For your love is before my eyes; \*  
I have walked faithfully with you.
- 4 **I have not sat with the worthless, \*  
nor do I consort with the deceitful.**
- 5 I have hated the company of evildoers; \*  
I will not sit down with the wicked.
- 6 **I will wash my hands in innocence, O Lord, \*  
that I may go in procession round your altar,**
- 7 Singing aloud a song of thanksgiving \*  
and recounting all your wonderful deeds.
- 8 **Lord, I love the house in which you dwell  
and the place where your glory abides.**

## THE FIRST LESSON Romans 12:9-21

Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honour. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God; for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." No, "if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads." Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

*Minister* We praise thee, O God;

*People* **we acknowledge thee to be the Lord.  
All the earth doth worship thee, the Father everlasting.**

*Minister* To thee all Angels cry aloud,  
the Heavens and all the Powers therein.

*People* **To thee Cherubim and Seraphim continually do cry,  
Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of hosts;  
Heaven and earth are full of the Majesty of thy glory.**

*Minister* The glorious company of the Apostles praise thee;

*People* **The goodly fellowship of the Prophets praise thee;**

*Minister* The noble army of Martyrs praise thee;

*People* **The holy Church throughout all the world doth acknowledge thee,**

*Minister* The Father, of an infinite Majesty;

*People* **Thine honourable, true, and only Son; Also the Holy Ghost, the Comforter.**

*Minister* Thou art the King of Glory, O Christ.

Thou art the everlasting Son of the Father.

*People* **When thou tookest upon thee to deliver man,  
thou didst not abhor the Virgin's womb.**

*Minister* When thou hadst overcome the sharpness of death,  
thou didst open the kingdom of heaven to all believers.

*People* **Thou sittest at the right hand of God, in the glory of the Father.  
We believe that thou shalt come to be our Judge.**

*Minister* We therefore pray thee, help thy servants,  
whom thou hast redeemed with thy precious blood.

*People* **Make them to be numbered with thy Saints, in glory everlasting.**

From that time on, Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and undergo great suffering at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him, saying, "God forbid it, Lord! This must never happen to you." But he turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to me; for you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things."

Then Jesus told his disciples, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it. For what will it profit them if they gain the whole world but forfeit their life? Or what will they give in return for their life? For the Son of Man is to come with his angels in the glory of his Father, and then he will repay everyone for what has been done. Truly I tell you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the Son of Man coming in his kingdom."

*Reader* The Gospel of Christ.

*All* **Praise be to thee, O Christ.**

#### THE HOMILY

#### THE APOSTLES' CREED

**I believe in God the Father Almighty,  
Maker of heaven and earth:**

**And in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord,  
Who was conceived by the Holy Ghost,  
Born of the Virgin Mary,  
Suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
Was crucified, dead, and buried:  
He descended into hell;  
The third day he rose again from the dead;  
He ascended into heaven,  
And sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty;  
From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.**

**I believe in the Holy Ghost;  
The holy Catholic Church;  
The Communion of Saints;  
The Forgiveness of sins;  
The Resurrection of the body,  
And the Life everlasting. Amen.**

*And after the Creed these prayers following:*

*Minister* The Lord be with you;

*People* **And with thy spirit.**

*Minister* Let us pray.

Lord, have mercy upon us.

*People* **Christ, have mercy upon us.**

*Minister* Lord, have mercy upon us.

**Our Father who art in heaven,  
Hallowed be thy Name,  
Thy kingdom come,  
Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread;  
And forgive us our trespasses,  
As we forgive them that trespass against us;  
And lead us not into temptation,  
But deliver us from evil.  
Amen.**

*Then the Priest shall say:*

O Lord, show thy mercy upon us;

*People* **And grant us thy salvation.**

*Priest* O Lord, save the Queen;

*People* **And mercifully hear us when we call upon thee.**

*Priest* Endue thy Ministers with righteousness;

*People* **And make thy chosen people joyful.**

*Priest* O Lord, save thy people;

*People* **And bless thine inheritance.**

*Priest* Give peace in our time, O Lord;

*People* **And evermore mightily defend us.**

*Priest* O God, make clean our hearts within us;

*People* **And take not thy Holy Spirit from us.**

THE COLLECT OF THE DAY, *together with any other Collects appointed to be said,  
and these two prayers in order.*

Author and Giver of all good things, graft in our hearts the love of your name, increase in us true religion, nourish us in all goodness, and of your great mercy keep us in the same; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

*The Second Collect, for Peace.*

O God, who art the author of peace and lover of concord, in knowledge of whom standeth our eternal life, whose service is perfect freedom: Defend us thy humble servants in all assaults of our enemies; that we, surely trusting in thy defence, may not fear the power of any adversaries; through the might of Jesus Christ our Lord.

**Amen.**

*The Third Collect, for Grace.*

O Lord our heavenly Father, Almighty and everlasting God, who hast safely brought us to the beginning of this day: Defend us in the same with thy mighty power; and grant that this day we fall into no sin, neither run into any kind of danger; but that all our doings may be ordered by thy governance, to do always that is righteous in thy sight; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

**Amen.**

*A Prayer for the Queen and the Commonwealth.*

Almighty God, the fountain of all goodness, we humbly beseech thee to bless our Sovereign Lady, Queen Elizabeth, the Parliaments of the Commonwealth, and all who are set in authority under her; that they may order all things in wisdom, righteousness, and peace, to the honour of thy holy Name, and the good of thy Church and people; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

**Amen.**

*A Prayer for the Clergy and People.*

Almighty and everlasting God, from whom cometh every good and perfect gift: Send down upon our Bishops and Clergy, and all Congregations committed to their charge, the healthful Spirit of thy grace; and that they may truly please thee, pour upon them the continual dew of thy blessing. Grant this, O Lord, for the honour of our Advocate and Mediator, Jesus Christ.
