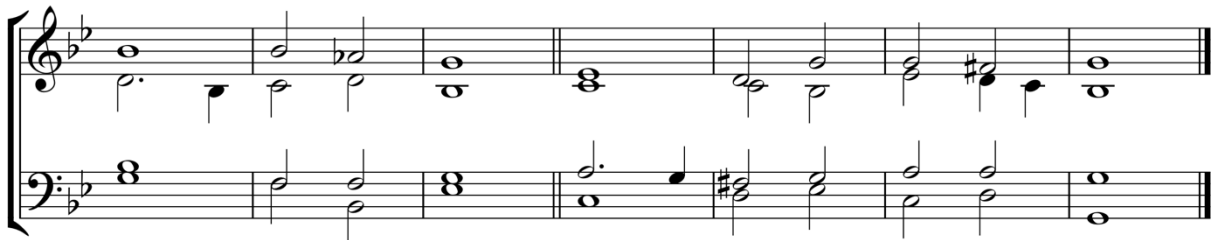
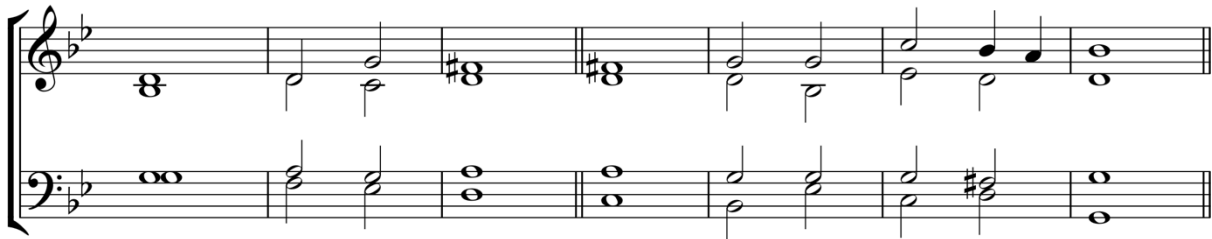
# PSALM 5

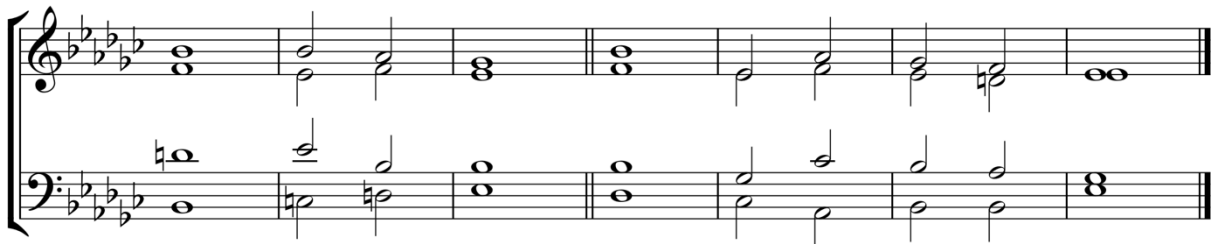
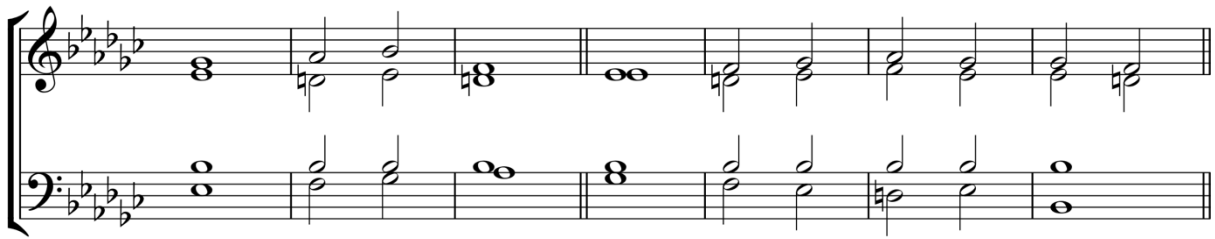

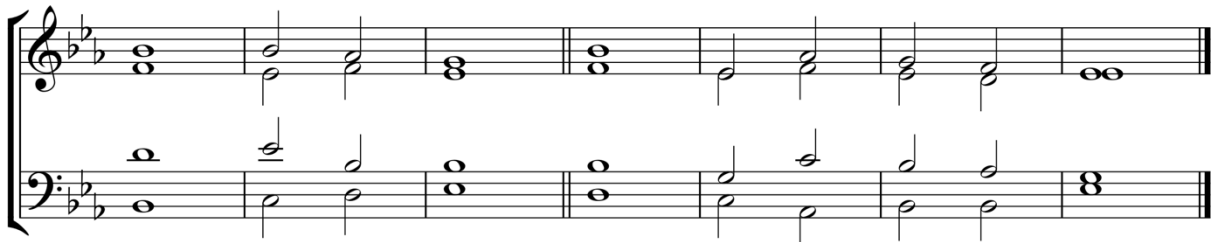
