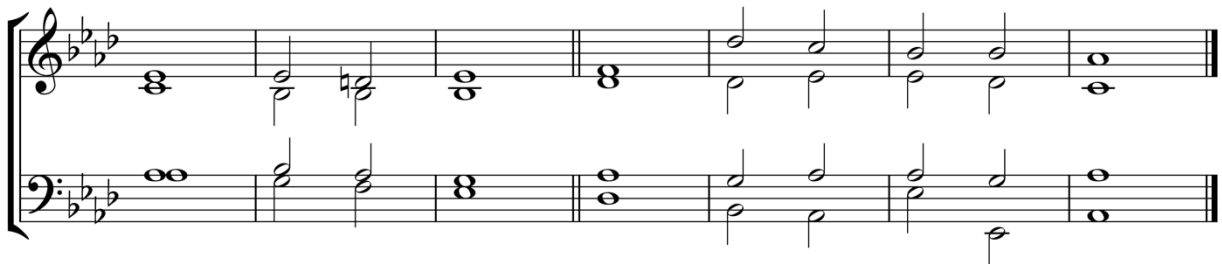
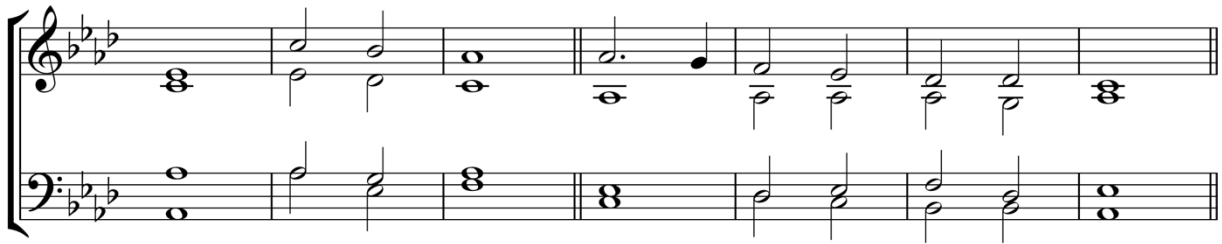
1. O LORD my God in thee have I | put my | trust :

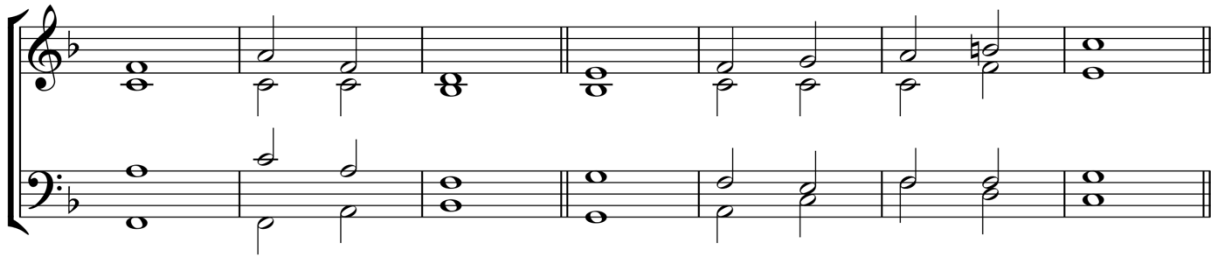

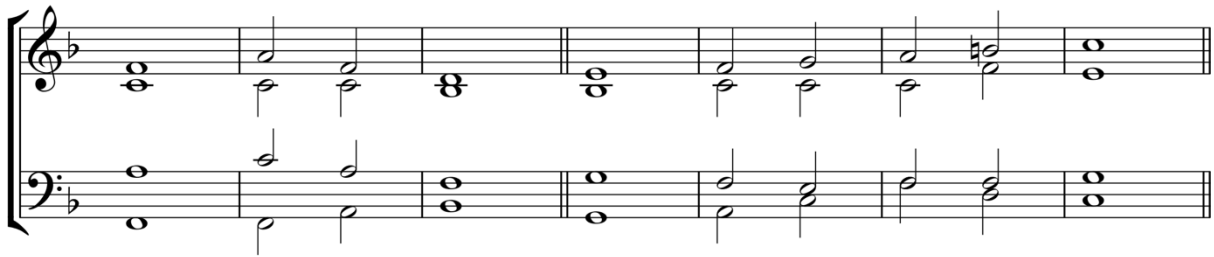
